

Commercial and Business Law Committee – Terms of Reference

The Commercial and Business Law Committee is a law reform committee established by the New Zealand Law Society Board to:

- 1. Monitor and comment on proposals for legislative, regulatory, or other change in the area of commercial and business law.
- 2. Work collaboratively with other law reform committees where there are areas of mutual interest and expertise.
- 3. Provide advice to the President and Board of the New Zealand Law Society on issues relating to commercial and business law.
- 4. Alongside the in-house Law Reform & Advocacy Team, maintain good working relationships with key stakeholders. This may include attending meetings with Government departments, participating on working groups, and working with other representative organisations.
- 5. Engage with commercial and business lawyers across Aotearoa/the various regions to better understand issues which impact access to justice, and issues affecting commercial and business lawyers.

Collectively, the Committee should have a broad mix of experience across commercial and business law practice.
