

Courthouse Committee – Terms of Reference

The Courthouse Committee is a law reform committee established by the New Zealand Law Society Board to:

- 1. Assist the Law Society in advocating for operational changes which would improve courthouse access, health and safety, facilities, and the use of technology in courts.
- 2. Work collaboratively with other law reform committees where there are areas of mutual interest and expertise.
- 3. Provide advice to the President and Board of the New Zealand Law Society on significant issues relating to courthouses throughout the country.
- 4. Alongside the in-house Law Reform & Advocacy Team, maintain good working relationships with key stakeholders. This may include attending meetings with Government departments, participating on working groups, and working with other representative organisations.
- 5. Engage with lawyers across Aotearoa to monitor health, safety and security issues, and to escalate these to the Law Society where they cannot be adequately remedied at a local level.
- 6. To assist the Law Society in respect of participation in courthouse design or re-design and the provision of lawyer's rooms and library research facilities for the profession.
