

# Certificate of Character referee report

### Fit and proper person

When assessing whether an applicant is a fit and proper person to be admitted, the New Zealand Law Society Te Kāhui Ture o Aotearoa (Law Society) takes into account the functions required for the practice of law. This is essential to enable regulation of the profession in a way that protects both consumers of legal services and the wellbeing of practitioners.

These functions include (but are not limited to): adhering to lawyers' fundamental ethical obligations to clients and the courts; and making careful judgements sometimes in time critical and stressful situations. It will also be relevant to consider any behaviour which may potentially impact adversely on clients, other members of the legal profession, or members of the public.

While it is expected that applicant would declare a persistent or recurrent condition, minor mental health matters and one-off episodes of illness need not be declared, nor mild anxiety during exam time. #### Referee information

Applicants must provide an employer reference and general character references.

A general character referee must be someone who:

- has known the applicant personally for five years or more, and
- knows the applicant well and can speak about the applicant's character and personal qualities.

General character referees could be:

- Lawyers (holding a current practising certificate)
- People who must be registered for their occupation; for example, teacher, doctors, nurses and other health professionals, social workers,

legal executives, real estate agents and engineers

- Kaumātua
- Members of the New Zealand Police
- Serving members of the armed forces
- Ministers of religion

#### Who cannot be a referee?

- Members of the applicant's family (including inlaws).
- The spouse or partner of someone who has already provided a reference.

If you are unsure of whether the provisions of the Criminal Records (Clean Slate) Act 2004 may apply to any previous conduct by the applicant, you should discuss this with them in advance of completing this form.

Please answer the questions in this form as fully as possible.

Inadequate responses may delay the processing of the applicant's application.

In order to be accepted, the original copy of this referee report must be posted to the Law Society.

A PDF version of this report sent via email will also be accepted, but only if the reference is:

- supplied by a lawyer (holding a current practising certificate) and emailed directly to the Law Society from the lawyer; or
- from a non-lawyer and emailed directly to the Law Society from a verifiable email address; for example, a
  government or recognised non-government organisation such as
  [department].govt.nz or [public company].co.nz or [charity].org.nz

In some cases, the original may still be requested.
