Please note: Access cards can only be issued to currently practicing lawyers or New Zealand Law Society associate members.

Signatories must read and accept:

1) Cards are issued on an individual basis to New Zealand Law Society member lawyers and must not be used to allow another person access to the library, or to any restricted area, including clients, witnesses or family. Proper use of the card is the responsibility of the signatory.

2) Cards must not be given to persons who have no right of admission to the library. No person is allowed to follow the card holder through the door (tail-gating).

3) New cards are provided for a fee of \$30 plus GST. Cardholders must notify the library immediately when a card is lost. There will be a replacement charge of \$40 plus GST.

4) When collecting cards from the library you will be required to show ID.

5) Cardholders must not write on the card to identify where it can be used.

Privacy and information handling
